

The book offers a plethora of activities, which we have included below for easy reference. There is also a comprehensive glossary and don't forget to check out the Fun Facts pages!

Suggested Activities

Class Presentations

Ask students to choose a particular star or planet and do some further research. This can be presented to the class as an oral presentation, a slide show, a Prezi, a short video or even a podcast.

Students might like to make an informative poster on a chosen planet, constellation or star to share with the class.

As a class, investigate why light pollution is a problem in Australia and which animals it is affecting. You might like to start with this video https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=ZAcL4FKPtHw&t=14s

Letter from a Planet

Write a letter from a chosen planet imagining you are that planet. What would you like the world to know about you? How might you describe what you can see from your vantage point in the sky?

6 Word Story

Using only six words, write a story about a chosen star, constellation, or planet.

- Help fight light pollution in Australia: australasiandarkskyalliance.org
- Pick a perfect stargazing location near you with this dark-places map: darksitefinder.com
- Find out the current lunar phase: timeanddate.com/moon/phases
- See an up-to-date map of the night sky from the Sydney Observatory or Perth's Scitech museum
 (choose the one closest to you): maas.museum/observations/category/monthly- sky-guides
 scitech.org.au/explore/the-sky-tonight
- Stargaze and planet hop like a pro with these night sky apps:
 Sky Guide (\$4.49, available for iPhone)
 or SkyView Lite (free, but has fewer features; available for iPhone and Android)
- Capture images of stars, planets, star trails and even the southern lights with this photo app: NightCap Camera (\$4.49, available for iPhone)
- Look up the position of planets in your area tonight: timeanddate.com/astronomy/night
- Explore the surface of the moon: **quickmap.lroc.asu.edu** Note: the default map shows a view of the Moon in the Northern Hemisphere pick the Lunar Globe (3D) projec- tion and drag the image to match the Moon as it appears in the Australian sky. Select the 'nomenclature' overlay to see the names of maria and craters.
- View an eclipse safely using a homemade pinhole camera like this one:
 jpl.nasa.gov/edu/learn/project how-to-make-a- pinhole-camera
- Find out when the International Space Station will be flying over your location next:
 spotthestation.nasa.gov
- Look up the location of the Starlink satellites, a mega-constellation of more than 1200 small space- craft that beam fast wi-fi to Earth: findstarlink.com
- Keep an eye on the aurora forecast for your area at the Bureau of Meteorology website:
 sws.bom.gov.au/Aurora
- Join your local amateur astronomical society: astronomy.org.au/amateur/amateur-societies/ australia
